

#### Readings for Sep 19, 2021 Twenty-fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time

#### Wisdom 2:12, 17-20

Let us condemn him to a shameful death.

**Psalm 54:3-4, 5, 6-8** The Lord upholds my life.

#### James 3:16–4:3

The fruit of righteousness is sown in peace for those who cultivate peace.

#### Mark 9:30-37

The Son of Man is to be handed over . . . . Whoever wishes to be first will be the servant of all.

#### Reflection

The first reading and the gospel invite us to shape our perspective to think not as human beings do but as God does. Those who cling to the truth and devote their lives tot faithful discipleship can proclaim with the suffering servant, "The Lord is my help,/ therefore I am not disgraced."

#### A Liberating Sign of Love

[T]he Christian gospel is more than a transcendent reality, more than "going to heaven when I die, to shout salvation as I fly." It is also an immanent reality—a powerful liberating presence among the poor right now in their midst, "building them up where they are torn down and propping them up on every leaning side." The gospel is found wherever poor people struggle for justice, fighting for their right to life, liberty, and the pursuit of happiness. Bee Jenkins's claims that "Jesus won't fail you" was made in the heat of the struggle for civil rights in Mississippi, and such faith gave her strength and courage to fight for justice against overwhelming odds. Without concrete signs of divine presence in the lives of the poor, the gospel becomes simply an opiate; rather than liberating the powerless from humiliation and suffering, the gospel becomes a drug that helps them adjust to this world by looking for "pie in the sky."

. . God's word is paradoxical, or, as the old untutored black preacher used to say, "inscrutable," a mystery that one can neither control nor fully understand. It is here and not here, revealed and hidden at the same time. "Truly, you are a God who hides himself, O God of Israel, the Savior" (Isa 45:15).

Nowhere is that paradox, that "inscrutability," more evident than in the cross. A symbol of death and defeat, God turned it into a sign of liberation and new life. The cross is the most empowering symbol of God's loving solidarity with the "least of these," the unwanted in society who suffer daily from great injustices. Christians must face the cross as the terrible tragedy it was and discover in it, through faith and repentance, the liberating joy of eternal salvation. James H. James H. Cone (1938–2018), known as the founder of black liberation theology, was regarded as one of the most influential theologians in America. He was the Charles Augustus Griggs Distinguished Professor of Systematic Theology at Union Theological Seminary until his death.

ALL are invited to either day's training held, Sept. 12 or 19, from 9:45-10:45 am. Below are brief descriptions of just a few ministries looking for volunteers!

<u>Music/Choir Ministry</u>- Augustine, the great fifth-century bishop of North Africa, said, "Those who sing pray twice." So, if you can sing or play an instrument, and love to help others praise the Lord through music and song, consider joining the this ministry!

<u>Eucharistic Ministry</u>- In this ministry you can assist the priest and deacons in the distribution of the Body and Blood of Christ during Mass. Consider helping in this important ministry.

<u>Art & Environment Ministry</u>- Our purpose is to better lead us to focus on God's presence in the liturgy with the use of color, light, and symbols. To do this we prepare with the scriptures, work with our priests, learn the appropriate colors for each, and often work 'behind the scenes.' We plan for the flowers, banners, candles, appropriate furnishings, and coverings needed for each Feast. <u>Altar Servers</u>- The ministry of altar server in the Catholic Church is very unique. Other than the priest and deacon, no one else has the opportunity to participate so closely in the preparation of the Eucharist. Everything they do is a witness to their love of Jesus in the celebration of the Mass. Students in 4th grade through high school, who have received First Communion, are invited to be trained to serve on the altar.

<u>Sacristan</u>-The sacristan ministry is the ministry that is responsible for preparation of the worship space for mass, including the sacred vessels, and for clean-up after the mass. In addition, Sacristans act as coordinator for the other liturgical ministries prior to mass, making sure that ministers are in place for those duties.


